
# A Guide to Becoming a Fifth Grader at R.H. Brown Middle School

## How many classes are there?

## How long are the classes at Brown Middle School?

# What do you need to bring to class?

The supplies you need to bring to class vary from class to class and from teacher to teacher, and team to team. # How do you take notes?

Taking notes can be fun and is definitely helpful. If you do it right, it is very simple. In your classes you take notes often. The teachers write down information on the boards and you copy it down in your notebook or summarize it for yourself. Be sure to write neatly though, because it is important for you and others to be able to read your notes. Notes are very often the tools you need to study for a quiz or a test. Teachers know that note-taking is a new skill for most fifth graders and they go slow at the beginning of the year. Some teachers will give you copies of the notes just in case you need them.

In order to do well on a test or quiz, it is important to be organized. If your notes are clear and understandable, it makes it easier for you to follow them and study. When you take notes, be sure to use bullets, numbers, or letters before each fact or category. Remember to skip a line between questions, answers, facts, and bullets. That way it is easy to read.

Sometimes you may have to take notes the hard way. When the teacher does not write anything on the board and explains a lesson verbally, you are going to need to take your own notes. Right now you are probably thinking, "Well, how do I know what to write down?" Try to listen carefully as the teacher speaks and write down a few key points or facts as reminders. Leave some space between each fact you write down. Later, when you have a chance, fill in more information below each fact as you remember what the teacher said.

So as you can see, not taking is not very complicated and is the way to go!

## How do you stay organized?

One of the best ways to stay organized it to get a thick, strong binder. You need more than a regular binder. You need one with a zipper to protect everything that's inside. When you pick out your binder, make sure you get one that is big enough to hold everything. You don't want to have a bunch of little binders because you will be late for class if you are always trying to get things out of your locker.

Students also use a planner to keep organized. You need to know what assignments you have and when they are due. Each teacher puts the assignments on the board and it is your responsibility to write them in your planner.

#### Where are the lockers?

## What if you forget something in your locker?

If you forget something in your locker, some teachers will let you run back and get what you need. This might affect your responsibility grade. You need to plan ahead so that you have everything that you need for your classes. If the class hasn't started yet when you remember you forgot something you might have enough time to run and get it. You are only allowed to go to your locker before school, at lunch time, during transition, and after school. It is important that you know your schedule and plan ahead.

## What is the honor roll?

When a student enters fifth grade, they will try their best to do well in school, because they want to make the "honor roll." The honor roll is a list of students who have done well in all of their classes and have achieved a certain grade point average. To get honors, your grade point average should be between 9.00 and 9.99. To get high honors, your grade point average must be between 10.00 and 12.00.

Once you get to fifth grade, you will have core classes. There are four core classes that students have all year long, every day of the year. You usually have a related arts course for about six weeks, and they you will move on to the next related arts course.

Here is how you can get honors-or even better- high honors. In the example below, your courses are language arts, math, science, social studies, PE, music, and computers. You are given a letter grade for each course. Each letter grade is given a grade point value. Courses that meet every day (core courses) are given one credit. Courses that do not meet every day (related arts courses) are given .5 credits. The grade point value is multiplied by the number of credits for each class. They are then totaled up. Once you have your total, you divide it by the number of credits, to get your grade point average. If your grade point average falls within the honors range then you have made honor roll...Congratulations!

Confused yet? Ok, there is an example-
